

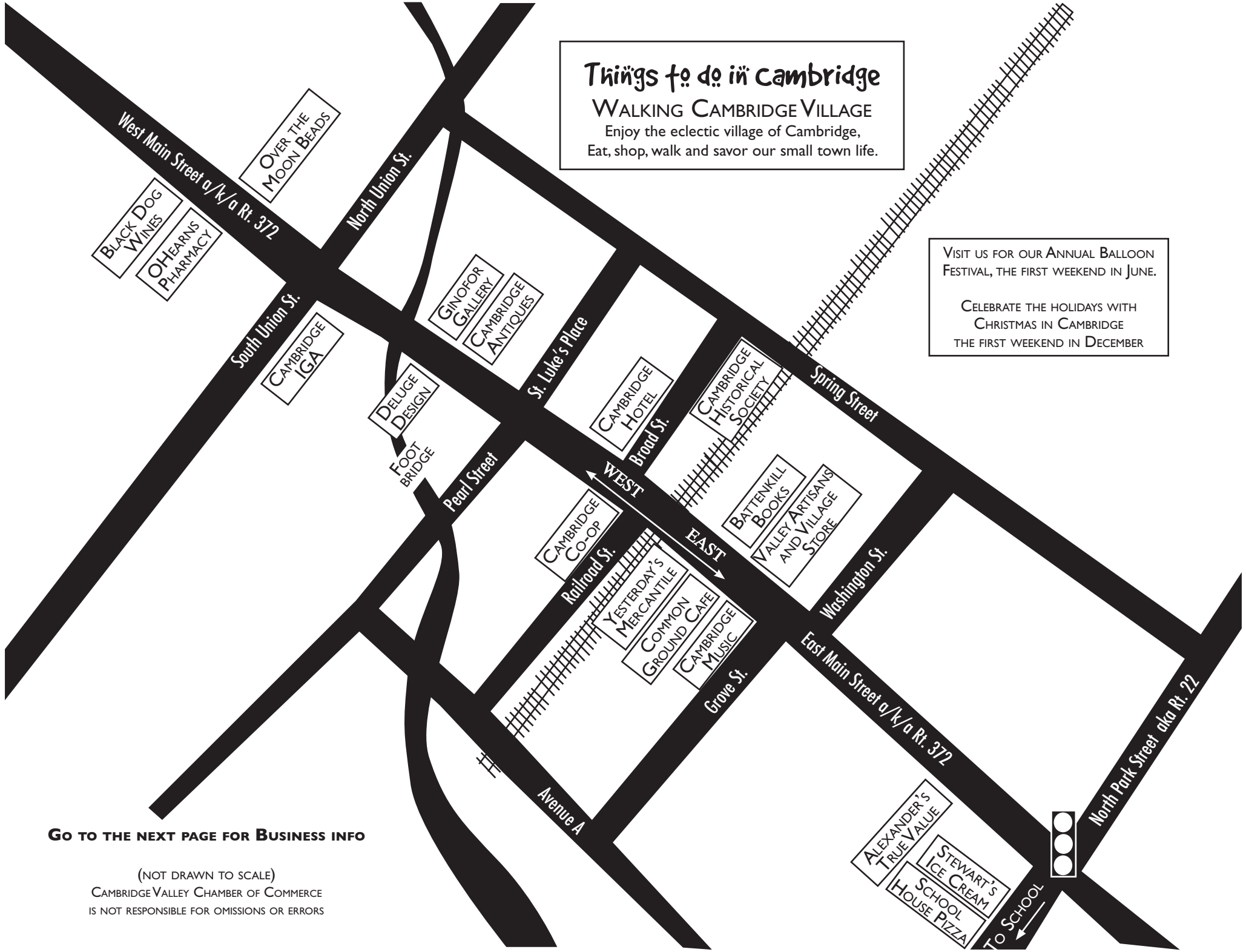

Walking tour and shopping guide of the village, without having to get in the car.

Eat, Drink & Be Merry

Dine and Drink at the **Cambridge Hotel**

Hang out in the tavern or on the porch, relax and enjoy this historic inn. 4 West Main Street

Common Ground Cafe offers fresh healthy food and a great selection of teas, mate' and coffees in a homey, craftsman built environment. 10 East Main Street

There is always room for dessert! Stop in at **Stewart's Ice Cream** and make your own sundae. By the traffic light, corner of East Main and South Park Street.

Pizza and more yummy food is available for the munching at **Schoolhouse Pizza**, next to Stewart's Ice Cream (Did you get my idea?) 2 South Park Street.

For a healthier alternative shop the **Cambridge Co-op**, where you can pick up some good-for-you snacks, local breads, a variety of cheeses and fresh produce. Sit in the park with your picnic and feel self righteous about your choice. 1 West Main St.

Practice Retail Therapy

Cambridge offers pretty good retail therapy, all within walking distance of the center of town.

From the train tracks heading West.

Cambridge Antiques Center has a HUGE selection of antiques from formal to country on 2 floors. Featuring 24 dealers from 4 states. 30 West Main Street

See how talented the Cambridge area is at **Ginofor Gallery**. George is an amazing photographer and he also shows the art of many local artists. 38 West Main Street

Deluge Design Stained Glass Studio is right across the street from Ginofor. Pam's shop has a lot of her own stained glass pieces and an eclectic group of other gift items. Make an excuse to come back to town, sign up for one of her classes. 27 West Main Street

Keep walking West and you will find **Over the Moon Beads and Gifts**, a colorful shop filled with beads and all the supplies you need to make something to commemorate your time in Cambridge. Over the Moon also has a large selection of incense, and other unique gifts.

Across the street from Over the Moon is **O'Hearn's Pharmacy and Gifts**. It is a locally owned pharmacy and gift shop with a hometown flair. You will enjoy their extensive lines of bags, jewelry, toys and local memorabilia. 55 West Main Street

Right next door to O'Hearns is **Black Dog Wine and Spirits** offering a wide selection of wines, spirits and advice about pairings. 63 West Main Street

Retail therapy continues from the train tracks heading East.

Visit **Yesterday's New Mercantile** which has Old-New-Used merchandise at affordable prices. A Little bit of everything. 2 East Main Street.

Battenkill Books in their new location is a beautiful store with a great selection. Connie carries books by local authors and artists, along with many about the region. Relax with a cup of coffee and browse the stacks. 15 East Main Street

Right down the street is **Valley Artisans Market**, a craft and art co-operative with a large and varied group of artists represented. 25 East Main Street

Next to Valley Artisans Market is **The Village Store**, an old fashioned store with housewares, unique gifts, toys, candles and way too much to mention here. A must see in Cambridge, 25 East Main Street

Across the street is **Cambridge Music**, selling new and used musical instruments, supplies and sheet music. They also offer lessons. 12 East Main Street

While you walk to buy the ice cream you know you want, stop in **Alexander's True Value Hardware**. This old fashioned hardware store offers loose screws, nuts and bolts, (just in case you lost yours) along with a big selection of just about everything else you can think of. 40 East Main Street

Have you had enough of eating and shopping? Now it's time to Burn off calories

Walk, walk and walk some more. Cambridge is a great community to stroll in and around. The side streets are quiet and the architecture is interesting. You may feel like you've been transported back in time to a 50's TV show where neighbors knew each other and everyone said hello.

Rest on the Covered Bridge benches, (a very unique foot bridge) one of two on the whole eastern seaboard. This unique structure was built in 1890 across the Owlkill for Rice Seed factory workers so they could get to work. Recently restored, so please no carving.

Relax in the parks, visit our lovely public library, sit on a park bench and watch the world go by.
